Contact information for applicant and mentor(s).



Sponsor-Partner Organization information. Choose the professional organization that is sponsoring your MFT award application.



Abstract: Proposed dissemination project summary.



Candidate Statement: Outline qualifications, experiences, and motivation for pursuing the MFT award.



Project Description: A comprehensive description of the project, including background, goals, and objectives.



Project Protocol: Describe project significance, goals, methodology, and evaluation.



Timeline: A detailed one-year schedule specifying the activities and milestones for the award year. Include mentor partnership milestones that meet and monitor project goals.



Biographical Sketches: Include biographical sketches for applicant and mentor(s).



Additional Support: In addition to your mentor, provide other associates or consultants who plan to contribute to the project. Provide information about the institutional facilities and support available to you.



Award Stipend Budget: Prepare a budget for the dissemination project that includes details and justification of the award stipend. See allowable expenses for additional information.



Literature Cited: Include a list of references cited in the application.



Funding History: Submit a letter detailing any current and previous funding received.



Mentor(s) Letter of Support: Obtain a letter of support from mentor(s), indicating commitment to ongoing project guidance.



Department Chair/Program Director Letter of Support: Obtain a letter of support affirming support of MFT award program participation.
